- 1 **1873-74 W.G.GRACE'S ENGLISH CRICKETERS TOUR TO AUSTRALIA**
A "George Budd" Cricket Bat, match used and engraved on reverse "Presented to Edward Elliott, by the E.M.C.C. For Fine Batting, in the matches England v Victoria, 1873-74".
Bat with some repaired holes. Extremely rare souvenir of this tour, the 3rd English tour of Australia.
"Grace was just 25 when he accepted an invitation from a consortium of the Melbourne, South Melbourne and East Melbourne cricket clubs to form a team to tour Australia in the summer of 1873-74....The team arrived in Melbourne on December 13. After a little practice before enthusiastic crowds, the All-England team took to the field at the MCG....A vast assemblage witnessed the game: more than 16,000 people were there at the start of play....Victoria won by an innings and 21 runs, to the great delight of the 40,000 who paid 2/6 to see the match." - 2 **1878 AUSTRALIAN TEAM TO ENGLAND**
Original photograph of the team (9x6cm), with title, "The Australian Twelve", and players' names printed on page, and with page affixed to mount, overall 29x29cm. Scarce. Fine condition.
Following a poor showing in their first match, against Nottinghamshire, the Australians, led by Dave Gregory, were keen to show their best in the match against the MCC. "The Demon Bowler" Fred Spofforth and "The Very Devil" Harry Boyle destroyed a team which one newspaper had stated was "as good as could be found to represent London and England... The MCC side included W.G. Grace and bowlers Alfred Shaw and Fred Morley. The bowlers did well enough but the English bats were cut down by the withering firepower and accuracy of the Australian bowlers. The MCC made just 33 in its first innings. Spofforth took 6 for 4, including a hat-trick. Their second innings was even shorter – totalling 19, with Spofforth taking 4 for 16 and Boyle 6 for 3. The Australians needed just 12 to win and scored them for the loss of just one wicket. There were over 4700 witnesses to this devastation, including 400 Australians, and both sides were "very vocal in their support." (Photo) \$300 - \$400

Original photograph of the team (9x6cm), with the title, "The Australian Team, 1882", and players' names printed on page, and with page affixed to mount, overall 36x42cm. Scarce. Fine condition.
"In Affectionate Remembrance of ENGLISH CRICKET which died at The Oval on 29th August 1882. Deeply lamented by a large circle of Sorrowing Friends and Acquaintances. R.I.P.
N.B. – The body will be cremated and the ashes taken to Australia."
This mock obituary, written by Reginald Brooks, was published on September 2nd 1882 in the "Sporting Times" following Australia's defeat of England in the only Test Match on this Tour. Australia won by 7 runs, with the match all over in two days. W.G. Grace top scored for his team with 32, while Massie reached 55 for the tourists. Spofforth achieved the astonishing figures of 7-46 in the first innings and 7-44 in the second. This match was the beginning of "The Ashes" legend – an international competition which will have its' latest chapter written in Australia in 2006/7. Overall on the 1882 Tour, the Australians played 38 matches, winning 23, drawing 11 and losing only 4. (Photo) \$300 - \$400

- 9 **1888 AUSTRALIAN TEAM TO ENGLAND**
 Original cabinet card photograph of the team with the title, "The Australian Cricketing Team, 1888", and players' names printed on mount (16.5x11cm), published by The London Stereoscopic & Photographic Company. Very scarce. Fine condition.
- On their Tour of England in the summer of 1888 the Australians played three Tests, winning the first and losing the next two. Australia's highest score with the bat was 32 (McDonnell in the 2nd Test and Lyons in the 3rd. The English batsmen did significantly better (Abel making 70, Lohmann 62n.o. and Barnes 62 all in the 2nd Test. However, it was their bowlers, led by Peel (24 wickets at 7.54) who did the most damage: Australia's highest score in the six innings was only 116 at Lords in the 1st Test. Overall, the Tour was far from disastrous: the Australians played 40 matches, won 19, lost 14 and drew 7. (Photo)\$2,000 - \$2,500
- 10 **1890 AUSTRALIAN TEAM TO ENGLAND**
 Original photograph of the team, with the players wearing their Australian caps, some damage to the list of players names, though photograph in very good condition, overall 14x12cm. Very scarce.
- England won both Test matches on this Tour (a third being abandoned without a ball being bowled as a result of incessant rain) and for the first time Australia lost more matches than it won in England: the Australians won 10, lost 16 and drew 8. The Australians showed themselves unable to handle the softer, damper pitches of the wet English summer. For England, one of the highlights of the 2nd Test was the bowling of Frank Martin, who took 6-50 in the 1st innings and 6-52 in the 2nd. (Photo)\$1,500 - \$2,000
- 11 **WILLIAM MURDOCH**, superb signature on 1903 hand-written letter to a young autograph collector.
- Murdoch, Australia's most successful 19th century cricket captain, played 18 Tests for Australia 1877-90, and 1 Test for England 1892, being one of five Australians to represent both Australia and England in a Test. He was the first player to score a Test double century, and scored the first triple century in intercolonial competition. Murdoch's signature is scarce, especially on a complete letter.  photogravure by Archibald Stuart Wortley (1849-1905), signed by W.G.Grace below image, and by the artist lower left, published 1st May 1891 by Messrs Manson, Swan & Morgan, Newcastle upon Tyne, Printed in Berlin, window mounted, framed and glazed, overall 67x79cm.
- Lord Sheffield persuaded W.G.Grace to captain the 1891 England tour of Australia. An iconic image. The original oil portrait hangs in the Long Room at Lord's. (Photo)\$3,000 - \$5,000

 Printed team photograph, with the title, "The Australians, 1893, 'Eighth Team'.", and players' names printed on mount, showing the players wearing unusual Australian caps & blazers, photo by E.Hawkins & Co., published by Hudson & Kearne, London, tear at base, otherwise good condition, overall 30x25cm. Very scarce.
- The 1893 Australians played 36 matches for 18 wins, 10 losses and 8 draws. The three Test series went to England, with 1 win and two drawn. (Photo) \$200 - \$400
- 14 **1894-95 ENGLAND TOUR TO AUSTRALIA**
 Large & exceptional poster titled "**Results of Matches, STODDART'S TEAM, 1894-95**", with portraits of the Australian & English cricketers, colourful cricket bats, balls & stumps, and a background of Sydney advertisements; published by John Milton & Sanders, for the proprietors at the 'Australian Star' Office, printed by W.C.Penfold & Co., Sydney, window mounted, framed & glazed, overall 128x105cm. Some repairs along folds, though the most striking cricket poster we have seen. We have been unable to trace another example.
- England won this Ashes Series 3-2. From the first match of the Tour, when 25,500 watched South Australia defeat the tourists to the 44,000 who watched N.S.W. lose to them, to the 62,000 who saw the thrilling first Test at the S.C.G. – huge crowds turned out to watch the cricket. But the M.C.G., for the fifth Test took the plum – a record 103,636 watched the 5 days of this great match – the largest match attendance to date in Australia. In the course of this enthralling Series, the public witnessed centuries for Australia from Giffen, Graham and Iredale and a 201 from Gregory; and for England by Brown, MacLaren, Stoddart and Ward. The bowling honours went to Giffen for Australia (34 at 24.12) and to Richardson (32 at 26.53) and Peel (27 at 26.70) for England. (Photo)\$5,000 - \$6,000

The article referred to 'Some Big Hits', so this is probably George Bonnor, nicknamed "The Colonial Hercules", who played 17 Tests for Australia 1880-88, and was renowned for his big hitting]. - 16 **1896 AUSTRALIAN TOUR OF ENGLAND**
A Season Ticket, 3-piece fold-out ticket, with blue leather cover gold embossed "Australian Cricketers 1896/ (Australian Coat-of-Arms)/ Admits to Matches on All Occasions. Not Transferable", inside numbered "91", with list of Australian players and complete fixture list. Extremely rare and attractive.

England won the three Test Series 2-1 after Australia was dismissed in the 2nd innings of the last Test for only 44 runs on a rain-soaked pitch. It was in this series that George Giffen became the first Test player to complete the double of 1000 runs and 100 wickets. (Photo)\$1,200 - \$1,500

Sydney, March 3, 1898: "Australia and England may well have entered a new phase of their cricketing relationship, following the 4-1 thrashing of the masters from the Old Country in this Test series. It started out in a somewhat expected fashion as England, with Ranjitsinhji (175) rampant, made 551 in the first innings and won the first Test easily. There was a hint of change in Australia's second innings when Joe Darling (101) and Clem Hill (96) flayed the English bowling and helped the score to a total of 408. That was the end of England's dominance for the whole summer, and even the colonial teams matched them, with NSW winning by a staggering 239 runs.... Just as England seemed likely to gain respectability in the fifth Test, setting Australia 275 to win, Joe Darling broke out again for 160, and Australia won by six wickets." "Ranji" was England's most successful batsman in the Tests, making 457 runs with a top score of 175. \$120 - \$150
- 24 L **"The Tenth Australian Cricket Team, With a Note on Unfair Bowling"** by Jim Phillips [London, 1899], original paper wrappers, tape on spine, and pages brittle with age. Rare.

"Wisden" and the "Times" agreed that the 1899 Australian team was the best since the legendary 1882 side. The Australians won 16, drew 16 and lost just 3 matches on this Tour. (Photo)\$800 - \$1,200

Titled inside front cover "12th Australian Cricket Team, Toured 1905 England, To Victor Trumper, from Wm Ferguson, Scorer, May 1905 - Sept 1905". A magnificent and unique record of all matches, compiled for Australia's pre-eminent batsman of his generation. 137 pages, original dark blue cloth binding, blindstamped John Wisden & Co. The last page records the results of the tour "Won 16, Lost 2, Drawn 19". Ferguson was official scorer and baggage-master to Australian touring teams for more than 50 years. He is also well remembered for the "wagon-wheel" diagrams of a batsman's strokes, which he conceived and drew from later in his career and which Australian captains used in deciding on field placings.] (Photo)\$20,000 - \$25,000

match-used "County Sports - The Victor Driver/ Specially made for Trumper & Carter, Sydney" Cricket Bat, with initials "V T" etched on reverse in the ownership shoulder position; used by Victor Trumper to make 50 runs in 5¼ minutes off 10 balls whilst playing for Paddington in 1907. Good condition for a match used bat. A rare and important survivor from Trumper's career. Victor Trumper played 48 Tests for Australia 1899-1912. Trumper "was the crown prince of cricket's golden age and a dashing and innovative batsman. Ten years after his premature death from Blight's disease, Hugh Trumble wrote, 'Trumper stands alone as the best batsman of all time.' "
Provenance: Presented by the Trumper family to Edgar Mayne (South Australia, Victoria & Australia) for display in his sporting good store in Melbourne's Block Arcade. Mayne's family gave the bat to "Swan" Richards in the early 1970s and he has displayed it in his sporting goods store until recently. Victor Trumper Jnr. confirmed the authenticity of the bat and it's history when Richards showed it to him in the late 1970s. (Photo)\$25,000 - \$50,000

Good condition.
 Australia won this series with an emphatic 4-1 result. Armstrong, Carter, Hill, Noble and Trumper all made more than 300 runs in the Tests and Saunders took 31 wickets at 23.10. The English had their stars, with Gunn, Hardstaff and Hobbs all making more than 300 runs and Crawford taking 30 wickets (24.73). Trumper's contributions had been modest in the first 4 Tests but the sun seemed "to have resumed its correct place in the heavens" and all seemed "right with the world" when he thrashed the English bowling in the fifth Test. In the last innings of the series he made 166 in four hours "against a worthy bowling attack." (Photo)\$4,000 - \$6,000

Frank Laver played 15 Tests 1899-1909. In the 1909 tour he played in four Tests, making 46 runs in his 5 innings (with 2 not outs) and took 14 wickets at 13.50. Note the 1897 Victorian team photograph (Lot 517) with 3 players wearing their Australian straw boater hats. (Photo)\$10,000 - \$12,000

Australia won the Test series with 3 wins and 2 drawn matches. England used 30 players in the five Tests, the visitors just 13. Four players took 100 wickets on the Tour – McDonald 138, Mailey 134, Gregory 116 and Armstrong 100. Six made over a 1000 runs – Macartney 2317, Bardsley 2005, Armstrong 1213, Andrews 1212, Gregory 1135 and Taylor 1019. (Photo)\$6,000 - \$8,000

The Keith Miller collection (Lots 145 – 202)

A cricketer of spectacular gifts, Keith Miller was one of Australia's finest all-rounders. A natural athlete with a powerful physique, he was an aggressive, clean-hitting batsman, incisive fast bowler and sure slips catcher. A charismatic cricketer, he played with a cavalier disregard for records, statistics and conventions, and often appeared to make little effort when the game was dull or one-sided, requiring a challenge to rouse him to action. Miller was only 18 years and 66 days when he made his debut for Victoria against Tasmania, hitting 181 with only 4 boundaries. He represented his State in 14 matches between 1937/38 and 1940/41 before joining the armed forces as a pilot. At the War's end he played a vital role in the AIF team that toured England and India, batting with joyous abandon and revealing his dormant ability as a strike bowler. Miller made his Test debut against New Zealand in 1945/46. His

Test career saw him selected in 55 matches, with 2958 runs scored, a highest score of 147 and an average of 37.97. He made 7 Test centuries. As a bowler, he took 170 wickets at an average of 22.97, his best figures (7/60) coming in the 1st Test against England at Brisbane in 1946. The 1956 series was dominated by Jim Laker, but Miller's magnificent performance at Lord's, where he took 5/72 and 5/70, gave Australia its one victory. His final Test was played against Pakistan at the end of the 1956 tour, injury keeping him out of the three Tests against India.

The Paul Reiffel collection

“Paul Reiffel was a nagging right-arm seam bowler and a very capable lower order batsman. Throughout a career which saw him appear in 35 Tests and 92 one-day internationals for his country, he was a player who distinguished himself with his ability to bowl an awkward line and length and to complement it with a capacity to cut the ball both ways off the pitch. His unstinting accuracy and control was also a key to his success. Reiffel experienced occasional problems with no-balling and was afflicted by a number of injuries that threatened to end his career at different times. But he remained an outstanding player and a highly valued member of Victorian and

Australian teams for more than a decade. The laid-back Reiffel retired from international cricket after forming a part of Australia's victorious 1999 World Cup side, and from his state at the end of the 2001-02 season.” John Polack – “cricinfo.com”
